The Agenda items for the meeting includes: Introduction of new courses, proposed intake, amendments to the Academic Regulations, NIRF Rankings, etc. She expressed her deep concern about the NIRF Ranking as we need to increase in the number of publications to achieve better ranking in the future. She suggested to nominate outside Supervisors for Ph.D. research scholars in order to facilitate wide variety of areas/disciplines for publications.
